Exhibitions and Mentoring the Next Generation of Scientists Internship, Oxford University Museum of Natural History

This is an internship opportunity to work with 2 different sections of the Public Engagement team within the Oxford University Museum of Natural History: Working with the Exhibitions team with a focus on evaluation and audience research, and mentoring and supporting young people in 2 targeted education programmes over the summer holidays.

Upper Thames Pleistocene Mammals Internship, Oxford University Museum of Natural History

Internship opportunity working with geological collections at the Oxford University Museum of Natural History. The project involves accessioning and documenting a recently acquired, scientifically important collection of Pleistocene mammals (from approx. 200,000 years old – 34,000 years old) from five local sites. Featuring specimens of: bison, horse, reindeer, red deer, mammoths, straight-tusked elephants, brown bears, cave lions, wolves, hyenas, woolly rhinos, and hippos.

Museum Conservation of Biological Specimens, Oxford University Museum of Natural History

This is anternship opportunity at Oxford University Museum of Natural History to recording conservation and preparation information of natural history specimens in the collection; amending and moving digital records.

Unlocking the Lantern Slide Collection, The Oxford University Museum of Natural History

This internship involves cleaning, organising and labelling the Oxford University Museum of Natural History's large collection of lantern slides. This is a collection that is unexplored and undocumented. Thus, an inventory will be carried out and the lantern slides digitised to increase access to the collection.
